Andy and Carol Hilger Pro-Life Scholarship	For a high school senior from St. Cloud Diocese area (including Cathedral, St. John's Prep, St. Cloud Christian School, Tech High School, Apollo, Foley, Sauk Rapids-Rice, ROCORI, Eden Valley-Watkins, or Sartell) or a college student from St. Cloud Technical College, St. Cloud State University, College of St. Benedict, or St. John's University who is active in a pro-life organization or activities. Requires a GPA of 2.5 or high and plans to attend 2 or 4 year college.	1 - \$1,000	Andy and Carol Hilger have been known in greater Saint Cloud for their passion for helping others, especially for those who are not able to stand up for themselves. The Hilgers have been tireless Pro-Life advocates.
Bernick Family Scholarship	For a high school senior who lives in Bernick service area in either MN or WI (check website for listing/map). Requires a GPA of 3.0 or higher and plans to attend 2 or 4 year college.	10 - \$2,000 (\$500 per year for 2 or 4 years)	The Bernick Family Scholarship was created to recognize the values of the Bernick family and their corporation, Bernick's. The purpose of the fund is to recognize, assist and encourage high school seniors who are well-rounded individuals in their pursuit of advanced education.
Bill and Joyce Coborn Memorial Scholarship	For a high school senior, college or graduate student that is a Coborn's employee with one year of service or their dependent (up to age 25). Student must be a full-time student attending a private high school or any technical, community or 4-year college, or pursuing a graduate-level degree. Plans to attend or attending a private high school or 2 or 4 year college.	10 - \$1,000	The purpose of these scholarships is to assist Coborn's employees and their dependents in their pursuit of a private high school or post-secondary education. The scholarships are named in memory of Bill and Joyce Coborn.
Brian Klinefelter Family Scholarship	For a high school senior who is a dependent student of local, county, state or federal law enforcement, firefighter or paramedic personnel from the following counties: Sherburne, Benton, Morrison, Stearns, Douglas, Todd, Wright, Meeker, Kandiyohi or Pope. Required to attend a 2 or 4 year college.	1 - \$1,000	These scholarships were set up to honor Officer Brian Klinefelter, who dedicated his life to his family and community. Brian died in the line of duty near St. Joseph, MN in 1996; leaving behind a daughter, wife, parents, and siblings. The family started this fund because shortly after Brian died, the community rallied around the family to make sure Brian's daughter would eventually be able to go to college. The family felt it fitting to start the Brian Klinefelter Family Scholarship to assist the children of law enforcement officers, paramedics, or firefighters in their pursuit of higher education.

David Torrey Memorial Scholarship	For a male high school senior from St. Cloud Technical High School who plans to attend a 2 or 4 year college. Preference given to student athletes OR student with GPA between 2.0 and 2.5.	4 - \$1,000	The Torrey Memorial Scholarship was created to honor a life that was well lived, but lost too soon. David went to Tech High School. He was especially passionate about hockey and was involved in a variety of sports and activities. David brought much joy and laughter to his friends and family.
Dorothy Timm Meili Memorial Scholarship	For a high school senior from Willmar, MN, who plans to attend a 2 or 4 year college and major in Music Education, Music Performance (vocal and/or instrumental), or Music Therapy.	1 - \$500	As a retired music teacher, Dorothy Timm Meili wanted to simply inspire others and help when she could. With degrees in piano and music therapy, Dorothy taught music in various communities and states. Dorothy's number one interest was music. Harlan and Jeraldean Palm Scholarship	For a high school senior from Litchfield or Atwater/Cosmos/Grove City High School who plans to pursue a degree in the manufacturing field industry including, but not limited to, machining, drafting, welding, engineering, metal fabrication or a degree in teaching industrial technology at either a 2 or 4 year college.	Up to 4 - \$2,500/year (\$10,000 if 4 yr; \$5,000 if 2 yr)	Harlan and Jeraldean Palm are leaving a legacy in Minnesota's manufacturing industry after many years and successes with Palm Industries and the multiple companies under it. Harlan is a self-proclaimed gear head which he says is a "generic name for people who can't leave things alone." For as long as he can remember he was always tinkering with things. Jeraldean was also an integral part of the business. She worked as a bookkeeper along with raising their four children and being involved in their church and community. In 1970 Harlan started Palm Industries. There have been numerous spin-off companies and various ventures along the way. They have made grain bins, trailers as well as cabs and attachments for machinery. By the late 1980's Harlan expanded the business significantly through a deal with the Bobcat Company. The Palms are proud of being able to create good jobs in their community. Jeraldean has noted that it was not only Harlan's salesmanship but also his management and treatment of employees that built a good reputation. "It's been a very fun business. It didn't even seem like work," Harlan Palm said.
Leo and Agnes Bauerly Scholarship	For a high school senior from Foley, Milaca, Cathedral or St. Cloud Technical High School with a GPA of 2.5 or above, who has participated in 4-H or FFA or is from a farm family and plans to attend a 2 or 4 year college.	1 - \$1,000	Education was very important to Agnes and Leo Bauerly. Agnes and Leo grew up during a time when getting even a high school education was an achievement. Agnes was able to attend high school and got her diploma by living in town with a family and was their housekeeper. Leo had an entrepreneurial spirit and started a family trucking business. Agnes and Leo worked side by side until Leo's passing. Their children grew the business that was known as Bauerly Brothers. The family and friends of Agnes and Leo have set up this scholarship, in their memory, for a deserving student who desires a higher education.
