







Rogers High School Blended Course Offerings



We are excited to offer blended courses for 2020-21 school year. Blended learning is an integrated learning experience that combines traditional and online learning in a purposeful manner that leads to enriched opportunities for students. In a blended course, students meet some days face to face in class with the teacher. Other days students will learn online, completing their lessons outside of class in a flexible location. During online days, students report to a flexible learning space that may include the commons area, classroom or off campus. Flexible learning spaces will vary by course and will be communicated by individual course instructors. These blended offerings allow students more control over the time, place, path, and/or pace of their learning. It is the expectation that students will be **self-disciplined** and **responsible** in managing their time and coursework independently during online days. In some situations, students may be required to attend class during their online days in order to receive additional support or advising. There also will be a **mandatory orientation meeting**, if the student and parent do not attend, the student cannot enroll in the course. Blended Course Name	Course Number and Credits	Course Description
Blended Economics 	73060 Grade 12 This course fulfills a social studies credit. 1 Semester, 1 Credit	This course fulfills the 12 th grade Social Studies requirement for Economics. This course will include a study of micro and macroeconomics, inflation and unemployment. The students will have an opportunity to examine such areas as the stock market, investments, the role of government in consumer protection, comparative shopping, taxes and supply and demand. Homework: Up to 2 hours per week.
Blended English 11 	72031 / 72032 Grade 11 This course fulfills an English credit(s). 2 Semesters, 2 Credits	This course includes literature-based reading, writing and speaking assignments. Assessments will include adept levels of comprehension and appreciation of literature, non-verbal communication and debate. Assessments will include advanced levels of discussion, reading and understanding literature of great writers. Homework: Students should expect 10-30 minutes of homework per night.
Blended Adv. Marketing/ DECA 	71171 / 71172 Grade 11 & 12 This course fulfills general elective credit(s). 2 Semesters, 2 Credits	Develop leadership skills! Build your college resume! Students in this course will produce advertising campaigns, conduct market research and develop skills in business & marketing. Students will participate in community service projects and plan and organize several DECA related events. This course has a strong emphasis on leadership development and professionalism. Students will participate in DECA (an association of marketing students) activities. These activities include: officer elections, competitive events at local, state and national levels, as well as leadership and professional conferences. Articulated College Credit(s) may be available.
Blended Government 	73080 Grade 12 1 Semester, 1 Credit This course fulfills a social studies credit.	This course fulfills the 12 th grade Social Studies requirement for Government. This course will emphasize the concepts and principles of American government, concentrating on our federal issues. Also included is a study of tribal government, worldwide government systems, and state and local issues within the United States. Homework: Up to 2 hours per week. This course fulfills a social studies credit.

<p>Blended Advanced Public Speaking</p> 	<p>Grade 12 1 Semester, 1 Credit</p>	<p>This course fulfills the 12 th grade English requirement for writing/speaking. Students will work toward speaking effectively at an advanced level as well as thinking critically and using the research process. Students will master various informal and formal speech formats, which may include debates, persuasive speaking, informative speaking, socratic seminars, impromptu speeches, group discussion, and oral interpretation. This course fulfills an English credit.</p>
<p>Blended World History</p> 	<p>73031 / 73032 Grade 11 2 Semesters, 2 Credits</p>	<p>This course fulfills the 11th grade Social Studies requirement. In this course students will learn, understand and demonstrate knowledge of how civilization has learned and adapted throughout time using the influence of social and cultural aspects. In Semester 1 students will study the developments of civilizations from Ancient time to the 1500 A.D. Semester 2 will focus on the evolution of these civilizations to the modern day. Geography concepts will be taught throughout the course</p>
